BIO 110 (Fundamentals of Human Anatomy & Physiology) is strongly recommended during the fall semester before entering the nursing curriculum. BIO 121 (General Biology) is also acceptable.

or BIO 110 Fundamentals of Human Anatomy & Physiology, BIO 121 General Biology I or BIO 171 Human Anatomy & Physiology I.

..If not previously completed BIO 110 Fundamentals of Human Anatomy & Physiology OR BIO 121 General Biology I or CHM 102 Introduction to Chemistry.

Prior to enrollment in the professional nursing courses, all students must have completed one year of high school chemistry or CHM 102 (Introduction to Chemistry) offered at FLCC or its equivalent. CHM 102 is usually offered Fall, Spring and Summer semesters. The chemistry course should precede BIO 171/172 (Human Anatomy and Physiology I/II) whenever possible and must be successfully completed before entering the nursing curriculum.

High school algebra (course 1) or GST 142 (Fundamentals of Mathematics and Algebraic Skills) is required prior to enrollment in any chemistry course and the nursing program.

A two year, four semester sequence of professional nursing courses plus any

other requirements in the nursing degree that were not taken during the first year of Pre-Nursing would follow. If full-time status (12 credit hours or more) is desired and all required course work is completed, the student should consider enrolling in: CSC 100 (Computing in the Information Age), MAT 121 (Statistics I), PE 214 (Advanced First Aid and Emergency Care), Humanities courses, and/or Social Science courses. These recommended courses may be applicable towards a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree. (Check Financial Aid implications)

Enrollment in NUR 100 (Fundamentals of Nursing) in the fall semester following pre-nursing is highly competitive and there is no guarantee of acceptance in the program. To be considered for enrollment, you must:

1. Successfully complete all pre-nursing courses that you have taken with a minimum of C in each course.
2. Notify the Admissions Office, in December, advising them that you wish to enroll in NUR 100 for the following fall semester.

NUR 100 requires a pre/co-requisite of ENG 101 Freshman English and BIO 171 Anatomy and Physiology I.

NUR 101 requires a pre-requisite of BIO 171 Anatomy and Physiology I and a co-requisite of BIO 172 Anatomy and Physiology II.
